A commander of a U.S. Space Force unit tasked with detecting ballistic missile launches has been fired for comments made during a podcast promoting his new book, which claims Marxist ideologies are becoming prevalent in the United States military.

Lt Col. Matthew Lohmeier, commander of 11th Space Warning Squadron at [Buckley Air Force Base](#), Colorado, was relieved from his post Friday by Lt. Gen. Stephen Whiting, the head of Space Operations Command, over a loss of confidence in his ability to lead, Military.com has exclusively learned.

"This decision was based on public comments made by Lt. Col. Lohmeier in a recent podcast," a Space Force spokesperson said in an email. "Lt. Gen. Whiting has initiated a Command Directed Investigation on whether these comments constituted prohibited partisan political activity."

Lohmeier's temporary assignment in the wake of his removal was not immediately clear.

[Space Force](#) Lt. Col. [Matthew Lohmeier](#), who was sacked from [his](#) command following a book [he](#) wrote and comments [he](#) made about a growing influence of what [he](#) called “neo-Marxist-based” race and diversity programs in the military, has a powerful new ally on Capitol Hill: the senior Republican on the Senate Armed Services Committee.

Sen. James Inhofe of Oklahoma has joined a growing list of [GOP](#) lawmakers who say they are concerned they are witnessing an increasingly politicized environment developing in a [Department of Defense](#) that seems to target service members making conservative or traditional statements that would have received little attention before the Biden administration.

Lt. Col. Lohmeier’s abrupt dismissal earlier this month, which is now being investigated by the [Air Force](#)’s own inspector general, is providing Exhibit A for those with questions of whether political correctness, “critical race theory” and anti-conservative biases are finding a home at the [Pentagon](#).

Notes on Irresistible Revolution

“Lincoln understood this relationship between the Declaration and Constitution, describing it by way of analogy in a composition that is fortunately preserved in a fragment of text. He draws upon the King James translation of Proverbs 25:11 – ‘A word fitly spoken is like apples of gold in pictures of silver’ – describing the Declaration as ‘an apple of gold’ and the Constitution as ‘the picture,’ or frame, of silver” (p. 40).

Half of his book is spent on teaching/reviewing the issues of Marx, Marxism, and Revolution. “There are many other schools of thought...that share its Marxist roots. Some of them perhaps sound familiar to you: ‘political correctness,’ ‘feminism and gender studies,’ ‘black studies,’ ‘queer theory,’ ‘postcolonial theory,’ ‘intersectionality,’ ‘Social Justice,’ ‘scholarship and activism,’ ‘identity politics,’ and ‘critical theory’ and its variants.” He then adds two variants “*critical theory*” (CT) and “*critical race theory*”(CRT) - last half of Chapter 5 (p. 93).

His final chapter 7 is titled “The wrath to come” and he quotes Tucker Carlson in part on the evening show on Tuesday, January 19, 2021. “I have included the pertinent parts of the transcript from Tucker’s show that evening. Again, the reason his remarks are relevant is because they reveal the rhetorical demonization of conservatives and whites in the country. It is specifically the kind of rhetoric necessary to justify violence against people...I am only interested in the rhetoric employed by those individuals to which he refers” (p.163).

Averting the Wrath to Come

“What is to be done about all of this? What is *our obligation...*? (p. 193).

- * *You and I both have an important role to play...*
- * *Avoid anger and violence.*
- * *Be courageous.*
- * *Get educated.*
- * *Speak up.*
- * *Live not by lies.*
- * *Pay attention.*
- * *Finally, if you wear the uniform of your country, do your job.*

“...our military services and servicemembers must remain patriotic (pp. 185-187).

Here is an example of the Wrath to Come. Only this Wrath is already here (or just driven in – or flown in). I wonder how many of “What is to be done about all this” list above is applicable when confronted by these guys? The black helmet is marketing a sticker that says “SHOOT PUCKS, NOT GUNS.”

My suggestion for the most important obligation listed above is **“PAY ATTENTION.”**

Connecting the Dots

Lohmeier from the front to back gives us a path for our education in determining the history of Marxism, where it is happening today in America, and he gives us some ideas of what to do about it. Although his book maybe more for the uniformed citizens it still applies to all of us.

I was intrigued with his command comments as a field grade officer in the Air Force. Will admit for a long time Lieutenant Colonels were not my most favorite people to be around as they seemed to get in my way going to the flight line to fly. However, my tour at SimuFlite with 16 years teaching active duty pilots how to be instructors caused me to focus on this rank. LTC Lohmeier fits the mold for someone who has his 'shtuff' together and should be promoted for his actions, decisions, leadership, and perseverance in writing this book.

I was intrigued with his demeanor talking to Steve Bannon. He held his own answering the questions about the title of the book, what he had to say about the issues, and what he had to say about what to do about them. Bannon also, you may recall, talked to Gad Saad about his book "The Parasitic Mind" who warned us with "Get engaged in the battle for reason and freedom of thought and speech. Your voice matters. Use it" (p. xiii).

I was intrigued with Bannon going from Saad, to Kotkin, and to Lohmeier on their books. Kotkin was featured in my paper "Comments on NEO" located on my Web site in the *FXUNCHKI 2020*⁷ folder. In February 2021 I asked this question on page 3:

Let me ask you a question:

"Why is our divided country at the verge of civil and social war?"

Actually, this might be better worded:

"Who is responsible for our country to be in the seemingly **grip of outright socialism and a Chinese take over?"**

I was intrigued with Lohmeier academic credentials from two masters' degrees by incorporating some books from another paper on the subject of "Constitution 101: Notes, Comments, and References" located on my Magazine folder. This paper reflects a quick history. Lohmeier shows these books in his 'Suggested Reading' list and they are also listed in my papers:

- * McClay, W. M. (2019). *Land of Hope: An Invitation to the Great American Story*.
- * The Declaration of Independence.
- * The Constitution of the United States.
- * Three books by Mark R. Levin.

You will be pleased to observe in Lohmeier's short book a number of references on each subject of each chapter – his work is truly a short cut to the heart of our problem today with Marxism.

I was also intrigued with Lohmeier's career in the Air Force as he and I share in a couple of areas like his 1200 hours in a T-38 (I have 1500 hours), and his F-15 fighter time (I flew the F-100). I wish that he could have been in my class (or me in his class) to enjoy some of the stories we have of 'defending the shores and the skies of America.' (Well, enough of that kind of poetry but I will waive the red, white, and blue!.)

I was also intrigued with a couple closing quotes:

"To praise American exceptionalism is to be labeled something mean – someone suffixed by a '-phobic' or an '-ist,' because to praise America is to belong to those vicious classes of people who are imperialists, racists, brutal capitalists, those who are oppressors, they who are everything that is wrong with society.

But those labels are lies" (p. 28).

"Our liberty is fragile, and yet so many somehow do not fear its loss" (p. 43).

"Marx declared: 'I long to take vengeance on the One Who rules from above,' and, referencing communists: 'We make war against all prevailing ideas of religion, of the state, of country, of patriotism. The idea of God is the keynote of a perverted civilization. It must be destroyed" (p. 72).

"How and why are these things happening?

'Two ways,' to borrow Hemmingway's clever phrase, 'Gradually, then suddenly'" (p. 90)...

"Briefly, we consider the following. Pluckrose and Lindsay describe how the kind of authoritarian changes rapidly occurring in our institutions at once become difficult to understand because they 'stem from a very peculiar view of the world – one that even speaks its own language, in a way.' The Cynical Theories they explain how the progressive Left has aligned itself 'not with Modernity but with postmodernism, which rejects objective truth as a fantasy.' Describing postmodernist Social Justice activists, they continue:

Within the English-speaking world, they speak English, but they use everyday words differently from the rest of us. When they speak of 'racism,' for example, *they are not referring to prejudice on the grounds of race, but rather to, as they define it, a racialized system that permeates all interactions in society yet is largely invisible except to those who experience it or who have been trained in the proper 'critical' methods that train them to see it. (These are the people sometimes referred to as being 'woke,' meaning awakened, to it.)* This very precise technical usage of the word inevitably bewilders people, and, in their confusion, they may go along with things they wouldn't if they had a common frame of reference to help them understand what is actually meant by the word" (pp. 90-91).

Lohmeier's Afterward

But fighting for what is right means first understanding the truth about what is happening. Only then, perhaps, will many more people act courageously in defense of their liberties and take a stand against a Marxist **revolution** that has become nearly **irresistible** (p. 191).
